Dear Parents

After the general election, the school officially becoming part of The Blue Kite Trust and of course last weekend's dramatic football finale, it's been a busy summer on top of the usual events which have been happening at school over the last few weeks.

Firstly, I'd like to thank the PTA for the super fete. It was a gorgeous day, enjoyed by all and the super funds raised will be of great benefit to the school. The PTA team also helped on our lovely sports day which was again a really nice occasion, the children participated and supported superbly, culminating in a fun day for everyone.

Year 6 successfully visited France again, with the Turing funding supporting the cost to the school and parents. A parents' meeting for the current Year 5 parents will be held on 9th September to give further details on next year's residential experience. On the trips theme, in March 2025 Year 4 will once again be visiting PGL - letters will be issued early in September with a parent's meeting scheduled for the 16th September. Both meetings will start at 6:30pm.

We've also had a busy time with assessments for a number of the classes. I'm delighted to inform you that once again we have achieved well above the National and Local Averages in the EYFS, Phonics Screening Check, Multiplication Tables Check and Key Stage 2 SATs. More details will follow in due course, but a huge well done to the children and staff for these great results.

End of Year reports will be sent on Monday, with attendance sheets included on the academic year so far. We will also be sending final attendance summary emails on Friday 26th July.

On the staffing front, we only have one change to announce and that is that Mr Woodman will be leaving his contracted role with the school. I'm sure we will be still using his services for many of our events however we will be seeing less of him in school as he enjoys his retirement. Mr Woodman has been connected with the school since 2000. In his time here he has been an MDSA, on the PTA, responsible for the school website, organised radio club, added magical filming, audio and photographic elements to a wide range of school events and of course has been instrumental in our eco and travel work. He has also transformed our school garden and developed a generation of keen gardeners, as well as supporting numerous classes and teachers on school trips. He has also used his wide array of knowledge and interests to support the children and teachers in curriculum activities. As you can see, he has had a huge impact on Wanborough Primary School, and we can only thank him for all his contributions.

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


